**Quinsigamond Community College, CSX Trees For Tracks, City Year and
ACT to Replace Trees Decimated By Beetles**

CSX Corporation, in partnership with Quinsigamond Community College, City Year, the Alliance for Community Trees (ACT) and Worcester Tree Initiative, returns to Worcester for the second time in just over a year to plant 101 spruce, arborvitae, dawn redwood, white oak, beech, sweetgum, flowering crab, flowering cherry and dogwood trees in an area once known for its tree-lined streets that have been severely thinned by the Asian longhorned beetle.

As part of their commitment to Moving Tomorrow Responsibly, CSX is undertaking a monumental initiative – the planting of one tree for every mile of the 21,000 miles of track across our vast network.

Tree planting will begin at approximately 10:30 a.m. on the campus of QCC.
